Dear Sacred Heart,

We have a few reminders about logistics for our upcoming Mass & Reconciliation location changes due to enhancement construction:

1. All weekend Masses will move to the gym across the courtyard on the weekend of **September 10-11** (This is immediately following Labor Day weekend). Access to the gym can only be gained through the School Lobby. This means you will NOT be able to enter the worship space through the courtyard entrance. For your own convenience, we have established a few additional disabled parking spaces in the Johnson Drive parking lot.
2. Daily Mass will be held in the gym on Monday & Saturday mornings only. We will host daily Mass on Tuesday – Friday in the Meeting Rooms. We will only enter the Church building through the handicap entrance at the circle drive.
3. Regarding Confession Times: Monday Confessions will move to Thursday while still maintaining the same time-frame. Tuesday – Friday Confessions will be held in the Ministry Sacristy where Altar Servers and Liturgical Ministers meet before weekend Masses. Entrance to the Ministry Sacristy will be through the Monticello Road exterior entrance ONLY (the one set of church doors on the Monticello side). On Saturday, Confessions will be in the SOR Work Room inside the school lobby. There will be directional signs inside the school lobby.
4. Finally, the Adoration Chapel will be moved to the lower level of the church in Room 37 starting September 1. You will park in the staff parking lot, and access the Adoration Chapel through the preschool entrance. All codes for the exterior and Chapel door is the same as before. Adorers will use the staff restrooms. Signs on the lower level will clearly mark entrance and location for both.
5. We have tried our best to anticipate all needs, but please be patient with the changing atmosphere during this “church enhancement.” If in doubt about anything, please call our office or ask one of our staff members. As always, we are most grateful for your patience and understanding.


Youth Ministry Volunteers

Do you love Jesus and working with teenagers? Do you have a desire to journey with young people as they find their identity and purpose and ask the hard life questions? Do you have a heart of service to listen to, encourage and build relationships with young people? Small group mentors are the heart and soul of the Youth Ministry experience. Our mentors come from all different backgrounds and have different gifts. One of the main tasks of a small group mentor is to lead discussion and activities during Youth Ministry sessions with a co-leader. Session plans are e-mailed out in advance so leaders can review and prepare before each session. Teens need to belong in order to believe. Small groups give them an environment where they are known, loved and cared for. Our Middle School & High School Youth Ministry programs are looking for adult volunteers on Wednesday and Sunday nights. Our Middle School program is in great need of volunteers on Wednesday nights. We have 2 meeting times: 4:30-5:45 or 6:30-7:45 from September to April. We currently have 70 teens signed up at 4:30, and need a minimum of 5 more volunteers to meet the needs of our teenagers, and our 6:30 session has similar needs. The time commitment for being a small group mentor would require about 2 ½ hours weekly. 2 hours on Wednesday nights and 30 minutes of preparation before youth group. Saint of the Week, St. Gregory the Great *Feast Day is September 3*




Saint Gregory the Great lived in a most turbulent time. There were devastating episodes of plague, the sacking of Rome and the breakdown of strong Roman rule, invasions by Lombards and Franks, floods, and a widening gap between imperial Byzantium and the Roman Church. Born around 540 into a noble Roman family, Saint Gregory was probably trained in law, and started his public service as a Prefect of Rome. However, upon the death of his father, he converted his family home to monastery, where he resided as a monk. He built six more monasteries in Sicily and one in Rome. Often called the father of the medieval papacy and Apostle of the English, Saint Gregory was proclaimed Pope by acclamation in 590. Although he was reluctant to assume this post, preferring the cloistered life, his accomplishments were many. He was an extremely capable manager of Church estates and tenants and is known for his reform of the liturgy. He was instrumental in the consolidation of papal power and led the fight against the many heresies promoted by small Christian groups at the time. Through his prolific correspondence he oversaw monastic life, curtailing the power of grasping bishops, correcting abuses, and enforcing discipline. He was particularly concerned with the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his monastery including Saint Augustine of Canterbury to evangelize there. Saint Gregory died in 604 and was sainted immediately. He is one of four key doctors of the Western Church, including Saints Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome.

Everyday Stewardship **Humility and Stewardship**

Some people have "the rich relation" in their family tree. Aunt Cindy, who is always traveling somewhere new and exciting. Cousin Richard and his lake house. Your sister and brother-in-law who buy a new car every year. Oftentimes these relatives take great happiness in sharing their wealth. You can usually count on an exotic gift from Aunt Cindy's latest adventure or an invitation to go out on Richard's pontoon boat at the end of the summer. Yet sometimes, that person wants something in return. Not money, of course, but something else. Attention. Flattery. Gratitude. Cindy wants you to ask her where she got the priceless artifact in Istanbul, so she can talk about the many antiquities dealers she visited. Richard wants you to ask about his new boat, so he can talk about how well business has been this year. Maybe the person just wants to know you like the gift or that the experience offered is pleasing to you. This is a natural inclination that we all possess. There is nothing wrong with wanting to be the person people count on. There is nothing wrong with wanting to offer worthy gifts. There is nothing wrong with hoping that maybe, just a little, we might be appreciated.

What matters is the spirit we carry within our hearts when we do it. What matters is our destination as we approach that proverbial table. Are we headed for the place of honor, expecting it to be waiting for us? Or are we making our way to the lowest place, simply thankful to be invited to the meal?

Catholic Q&A



Question:

I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?


Answer:

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.
