Dear Sacred Heart,



My name is Father Zarse and I am so excited to serve as your new pastor. I

come to you from the land of Nemaha, where for the last 5 years I have served as the pastor of Sacred Heart, in Sabetha, KS.

In his wisdom, Our Lord has chosen to keep me in His Sacred Heart for the third chapter in my story as a priest and I cannot wait to get started with all of you. Archbishop Naumann has asked that I bring everything that I have learned in my first two assignments to Shawnee, which includes serving as a high school chaplain at Hayden, working

as a chaplain in a maximum security prison, serving as an associate pastor with a school at Christ the King, to lighting fires as a pastor in Nemaha. Our Lord and Our Lady have taught me a lot in my 9 years as a priest and I cannot wait to get started with all of you.

Friends, what I have discovered in my time as a pastor is that we need to be "mission focused." Far too often, Catholic parishes are beset with politics, turf wars, silos and a firm commitment to dysfunctional behavior. And all of this obstructs the mission of bringing glory to God and working for the salvation of souls. We will be known at Sacred Heart for our commitment to creating a culture of prayer, which will serve as the foundation

for our culture of teamwork, which in turn will help drive our fruitfulness. Great things start small and if there is anything Our Lord has proven to me in the last 5 years it is that He has a dream for every one of his parishes. And we will know that we are achieving that dream the moment we begin to see "lives being changed." We will be targeting marriage and family, while promoting a culture of evangelization through small groups. I am truly grateful to see that there is already a foundation which Fr. Pat has laid for all of the above. It is really simple friends, the stronger our marriages and families, the stronger the parish. And the stronger the parish, the more fruitful the mission becomes.

Nine years ago I was ordained to the priesthood of Jesus Christ. And the honest truth is, that despite the six and a half years of priestly formation that I received, I had no idea what I was getting into. What I love most about the priesthood is the friendship it has given me with Our Lord and Our Lady. Our Lord has taught me to be fearless in preaching and teaching, a "lion from the pulpit." He has also taught me to be gentle and compassionate, a "lamb in the confessional." Friends, make no mistake, we are going to change each others lives and in the end, bring each other closer to Him.

Gospel Meditation

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

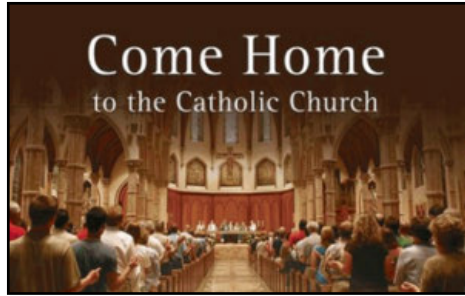

Recognize God in your Ordinary Moments *The Falling Action and the Field*

In my freshman year of high school, I was fairly miserable at identifying the five essential elements of plot (exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution).

To this day, the only reason I remember anything about them at all is because my English teacher used episodes of Scooby Doo to illustrate the different elements. Falling action vs. climax is where I got tripped up, the two are similar, and only discernible if you examine them relative to each other.

Every Scooby Doo episode has a big dramatic sequence (the climax) where the ghost/monster/zombie chases The Gang through the haunted mansion. The falling action is what comes immediately after: searching for her glasses that she lost during the chase, Velma bumps into a pulley wheel disguised behind a tapestry and realizes the ghost/monster/zombie is actually the janitor in a costume, hooked up to an elaborate cable system jerry-rigged throughout the mansion. Meddling kids. I confused the two because, to me, they are both equally dramatic: the chase and the fallout. It occurs to me that, if you look at the course of salvation history, we are living in the falling action, not the climax. Take the parable of the treasure in the field: we have found the treasure. But we haven't yet bought the field. I often make the mistake of thinking I am still lost in the climax, searching for the truth. But I know exactly where the truth is. What I need to be concerned with is this: am I doing what I need to do to buy the field?

The Eucharistic Miracle of Amsterdam, Holland

In Amsterdam in 1345, a devout Catholic man who had fallen ill desired to receive Communion. His family notified their local priest, who, after administering the sacrament, told the family to burn the sacraments in the fire should the sick man throw up. He did throw up that evening, and his family cast the purged Eucharist into the fire.

The next morning, the man's wife looked into the fire and saw the host back in its original form. Not fearing for her safety, she reached in and retrieved the host. Besides retracting her hand unscathed, the host itself was cold to the touch.

Despite plunderings and attempts to remove the host from the city, it miraculously remained there for several hundred years until the church was torn down and the Miraculous Host was lost in the early 1900s.

Why do we do that?

Catholic Life Explained



Question:

Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

Answer:

Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass — the “General Instruction of the Roman Missal” — we read: “The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist” (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the “Book of the Gospels” after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the “living stone” (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the “household of faith” (see Galatians 6:10).
