




#### **FIRST EUCHARIST**



## Gospel Meditation

First Sunday of Advent

Lately I've been listening to a science-based podcast on healthy daily living. The host frequently discusses the wide range of health benefits of sleep. So, each night I'm trying to get more, and better, slumber, and it's helping me feel energized. So, why in the world should we follow Christ's advice this week? "Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house will come ... lest he find you asleep." Isn't sleep, especially at midnight and cockcrow, a good thing?

Of course, it is. But the wakefulness the Lord calls us to is a deep, personal orientation to Him. A nightly vigil is therefore a metaphor for this, but it's not just that. We should give up real sleep in order to pray, too. This difficult practice is a time-tested way to foster wakefulness of heart. When we give up sleep to pray, it focuses us. We learn that life is not an endless series of days. You and I belong to the Lord — awake or asleep, in life and in death. Sooner or later, even our need for our physical sleep will pass away. And our attentiveness to God — that is, whether we are awaiting Him to meet us — will be all that matters.

May I challenge us this week and this Advent to intentionally give up at least one hour of sleep each week for prayer? Stay up later, wake up in the middle of the night, or an hour earlier, and pray. Will we be a bit more tired the next day? Yes. But we'll be amazed at the spiritual wakefulness that results, too.

RCIA Participants Dismissal

Why are some RCIA participants dismissed in the middle of our 9:30 Mass?

For the last couple weeks you may have noticed those adults preparing to be baptized into the Catholic church are dismissed at the end of the Liturgy of the Word. This will continue each Sunday until Easter when, at the Easter Vigil, those who are ready will join us at the Table of the Eucharist for the first time. Though they cannot yet come to the table of the Eucharist, the Church has an obligation to feed those who have entered into a relationship with her through the Rite of Acceptance which we recently celebrated as a community. God's Word is their food during this period. These participants depart from the Mass with an RCIA team member to discuss the Mass readings and to experience more fully the impact of the Scriptures in their lives. It is a most fruitful and joyful experience. Please pray for them and their time spent in Dismissal!








## Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained Wine Distribution

**Question:** Why haven't Catholic Churches gone the way of disposable cups for wine distribution?



Although practices for Protestant Christians can vary (ranging from large shared chalices, to personal-use cups, to dipping the bread in the wine/grape juice), the norms governing Catholic practices are fairly direct: "Sacred vessels are to be made from precious metal. If they are made from metal that rusts or from a metal less precious than gold, then ordinarily they should be gilded on the inside. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials that, according to the common estimation in each region, are precious ... they are to have bowls of nonabsorbent material" (nos. 328-330). Rather than being a commentary on the beliefs or practices of those other communities, these rules are intended to highlight the reverence that Catholics have for the bread and wine consecrated at Mass, which become the Body and Blood the Lord.

# **Advent Corner**

## Practical Tips for Advent

The word 'Advent' comes from Latin and means "coming"; its purpose is to look forward to the coming of Christ to earth; it is a season that focuses on waiting. So, Advent means something new is coming. The dawn of a new and better era! Here are some ways to help you prepare for Advent:

- **1.** Reflect on the "three comings of the Lord:" the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem; the coming of Jesus into our lives in the present time; and Christ's final coming in glory on the last day. In Advent, we wait and prepare for all three.
- **2.** Read some sort of short, daily devotion. Find a person or two to discuss your meditation. Consider the *Rejoice! reflections* or *Word Among Us*.
- **3.** Get some quiet time. Center yourself on Christ by repeating the prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus" to yourself, slowly as you breathe in and out with your eyes closed. (Consider visiting the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel...open 24-7)
- 4. Say NO, it's OK.
- 5. Listen to Advent music.
- **6.** Decorate. Catholics are sacramental people: smells, bells, stained glass, beautiful music, bread and wine. God can visit through our sensory experiences...so put out a nativity set and some candles and greens.
- **7.** Light an Advent wreath. In your "domestic church," add an Advent wreath tradition which is



a simple and lovely way to strengthen that smallest, essential community of faith.

- **8.** If you have young children, add a Christmas book to the bedtime reading list. Add a nativity book for children to your reading list. Remember how vivid and awe-inspiring the nativity story is.
- **9.** Support an organization that works for social justice. As the magi brought whatever they had to give the newborn king, giving gifts to organizations that further the building of the kingdom of God on Earth is one way to celebrate their legacy.
- **10.** Consider the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Advent is all about preparing, there's no better way to prepare than to open your heart and receive the spirit. (Parish Penance Service: December 6 at 7:00 p.m.)


### **Advent Movie Marathon**






# Sacred Heart School

## Recognize God in your Ordinary Moments Momento Mori

Just this week, my husband and I signed our wills, and the lawyer was careful to couch our transaction in gentle, abstract language: "When we lose you" she kept saying, instead of "When you die."

It's very uncomfortable to dwell on our death. But the Christian life does not just encourage us to do so: it demands that we do. I once came upon a prayer consecrating the last two hours of life to the Blessed Mother. I have since found variations of the prayer online with different phrasing, but the sentiment of them all is the same: let me not be caught sleeping. Let me be ready.

"You can't do all your homework at the end," a deacon who ministers to the dying once told me. "Good Friday is waiting in the wings for all of us."

I think of that a lot when I don't particularly feel like praying, when I think I'm too busy to go to confession or when feelings of resentment fester inside me on Sunday mornings as I pack my family off to church. All our good deeds are like polluted rags, says the prophet. We have all withered like leaves.

You can't do all your homework at the end. God is faithful. Are we?

# **Eucharistic Revival**

Dear Friends,

As we recall the many things for which we are grateful today, you may have heard that the word "Eucharist" actually comes from the Greek word for thanksgiving!

This past Saturday, my religious community hosted our annual Thanksgiving Prayer Brunch in Chicago. Through the tremendous generosity of so many people, we were ready to welcome over 200 guests for a time of prayer and a delicious brunch, sending each family home afterward with a complete turkey dinner.

Something that is very important to my religious community is offering the opportunity for Eucharistic adoration so that while some are serving those in need, others are adoring our Lord on behalf of all. We decided to go a step further this past Saturday, finding a way to share the great treasure of the Eucharist with the many poor people who came to join us.

All morning as we were preparing for the guests, people were in the church adoring Jesus in the Eucharist. As the time drew near for the prayer service, guests were quietly welcomed into the church as we explained that Jesus was present in a very special way upon the altar. During the prayer service, Bishop Lombardo gave a very simple catechesis on the Eucharist, rooted in the Last Supper accounts from the Gospels. His simple explanation was a gentle invitation for all to have an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist.

Even with many squirmy children, there was a peaceful atmosphere in the church. True, not everyone believed or understood the doctrine of the Eucharist, but the reverent atmosphere revealed that so many people were nonetheless experiencing God's presence.

I have been serving in our neighborhood for over 14 years, and I can say with complete honesty that we have never had a Thanksgiving celebration that went as peacefully, smoothly, and beautifully as the one that happened 6 days ago.

In the end, 300 guests and 150 volunteers enjoyed a delicious meal, and when you add those who came later for the turkey giveaway hosted after the Prayer Brunch, over 900 families went home with Thanksgiving dinner that day!

We are all hungry. In our own country, many people hunger for food, like the hundreds of people who came on Saturday. All of us hunger for love, and the only person who can truly satisfy that hunger is Jesus. Most of all, he longs to satisfy us with his total gift of self in the Holy Eucharist.

This Thanksgiving, know that Bishop Cozzens and our Eucharistic Revival and Congress Teams are praying for you! Jesus will satisfy the deepest hunger of your heart. It is an honor to be living this Eucharistic Revival together!


