



# Prayer

### Reflect on the Word

**First Reading:** God heard the plea of the Israelites who feared they would die of starvation in the desert and in response, God sent them quail and bread to eat. What will you pray for this week?

**Second Reading:** Paul taught the Gentiles of the Ephesian church to give up their former way of life and live with renewed minds in the truth of Jesus. What have you gained by being a believer in Jesus?

**Gospel:** Jesus teaches the crowds in Capernaum that he is "the bread of life" who feeds all who believe in him. Is there someone you know hungry for Jesus?



#### Gospel Meditation 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people - like us - must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need & to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for. "HAVE NO ANXIETY AT ALL, BUT IN EVERYTHING, BY PRAYER AND PETITION, WITH THANKSGIVING MAKE YOUR REQUEST KNOWN TO GOD." Philippians 4:6

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained Confession



Question: If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

**Answer:** Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.

#### Small Groups for Youth Ministry Called to share the Gospel with others

**Why small groups?** Teens need to feel like they belong in order to believe. Small groups give them an environment where they are known, loved and cared for. Other tasks of small group mentors may include helping out with opening and closing prayers, giving a witness/catechetical talk and performing in skits to the larger group. A good small group mentor listens to, encourages and builds relationships with the young people and is first and foremost, a disciple of Jesus themselves.

#### **Small Group leadership qualities**

- -- Loves teens and feels called to meet them where they are at in their spiritual journey.
- -- Loves God and has a desire to continue their own spiritual development.
- -- Has a humble desire to serve others and a welcoming/invitational attitude.
- -- Works well with a partner or a team.
- -- Has a desire to listen to, encourage and build relationships with young people.
